The minute you turn the key and slip into gear, you'll discover that something new has come into your life. Not just sensible. But strictly sensational.



Make no mistake. Dasher's engineering comes through to you at the fingertips with snug rack and pinion steering; negative roll radius suspension; a dual diagonal brake system that brings you to a controlled stop even should one set of brakes fail; and an economical 1500cc engine sitting over and driving the front wheels.









## The anatomy of Dasher

Where does Dasher come from?

Volkswagen, naturally. The handsome slope-back body style was created for us by Giugiaro's Ital Design because we wanted Dasher's looks to match its performance. Underneath it all is pure Volkswagen excellence in every single detail.

To understand what makes Dasher tick, let's take a look beneath the glittering, hand-rubbed finish to see what makes it go, what makes it stop... and what makes it the sensation it is.

Take a turn behind the wheel, Better yet, take a hairpin turn. Dasher's low and more forward placed center of gravity combines with the tracking effect of its front-wheel drive, its rear trailing suspension and stabilizer bars to reduce

leaning, squealing, rolling and the other turning characteristics you've had to put up with in most other cars. It's a leveling experience.

But we haven't stopped at suspension.

VW engineers have incorporated one
of the more exciting braking systems in
Dasher—"Dual Diagonal" braking. This
cross linking of front discs and rear drums—
along with a self-correcting steering
system—helps you come to a firm controlled
stop, even should one system fail.

The new in-line, 4-cylinder, overhead cam, water-cooled engine with two-barrel carburetor and balanced exhaust system—if that's not exactly what you'd expect to find in a car that sells for under \$4000,\* take another look. Then smile, \*POE EAST COAST.






You don't have to be a contortionist to drive a Dasher. For a small sedan it has all the head, shoulder, hip and knee room you could possibly want.

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And that's before you even reach for the easily accessible seat adjustment lever. After you've put yourself in the driver's seat, slide into the rear seat to see how much room we've given the folks back there. When we say Dasher is a 5-passenger car, we mean it.

If you're a tough comparison shopper, take a few full-size suitcases around to showrooms and be a trunk tester. Dasher's spare tire is neatly tucked away and leaves you with plenty of unobstructed luggage space.
