The commemorative SL2 features a unique pearl opalescent paint and a lot

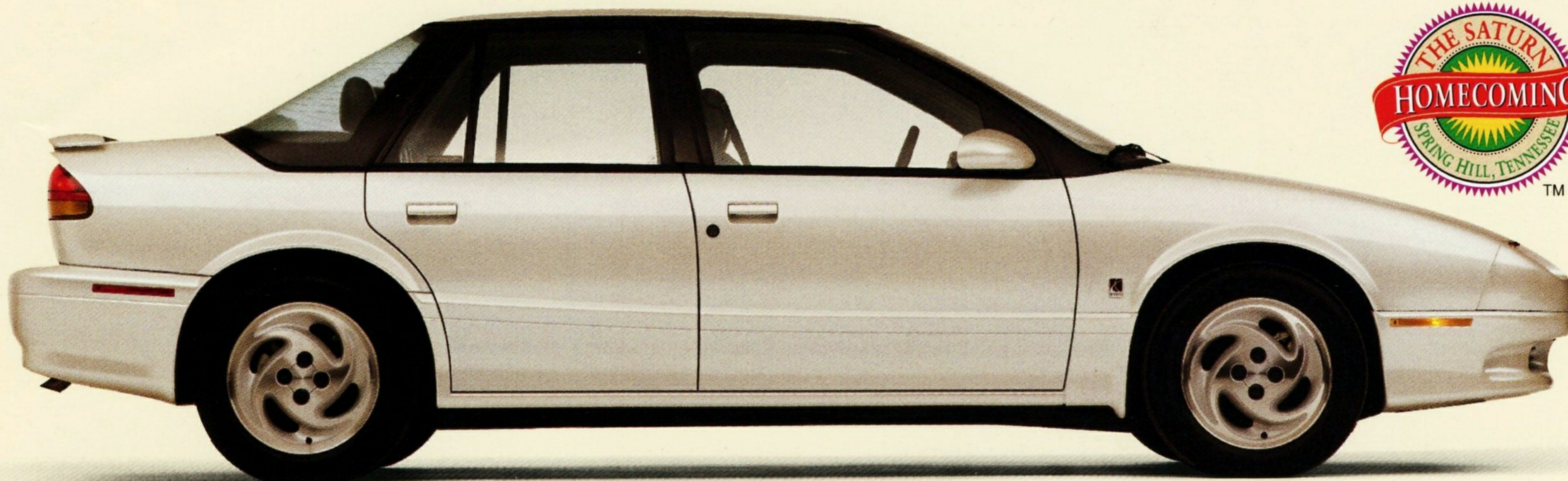
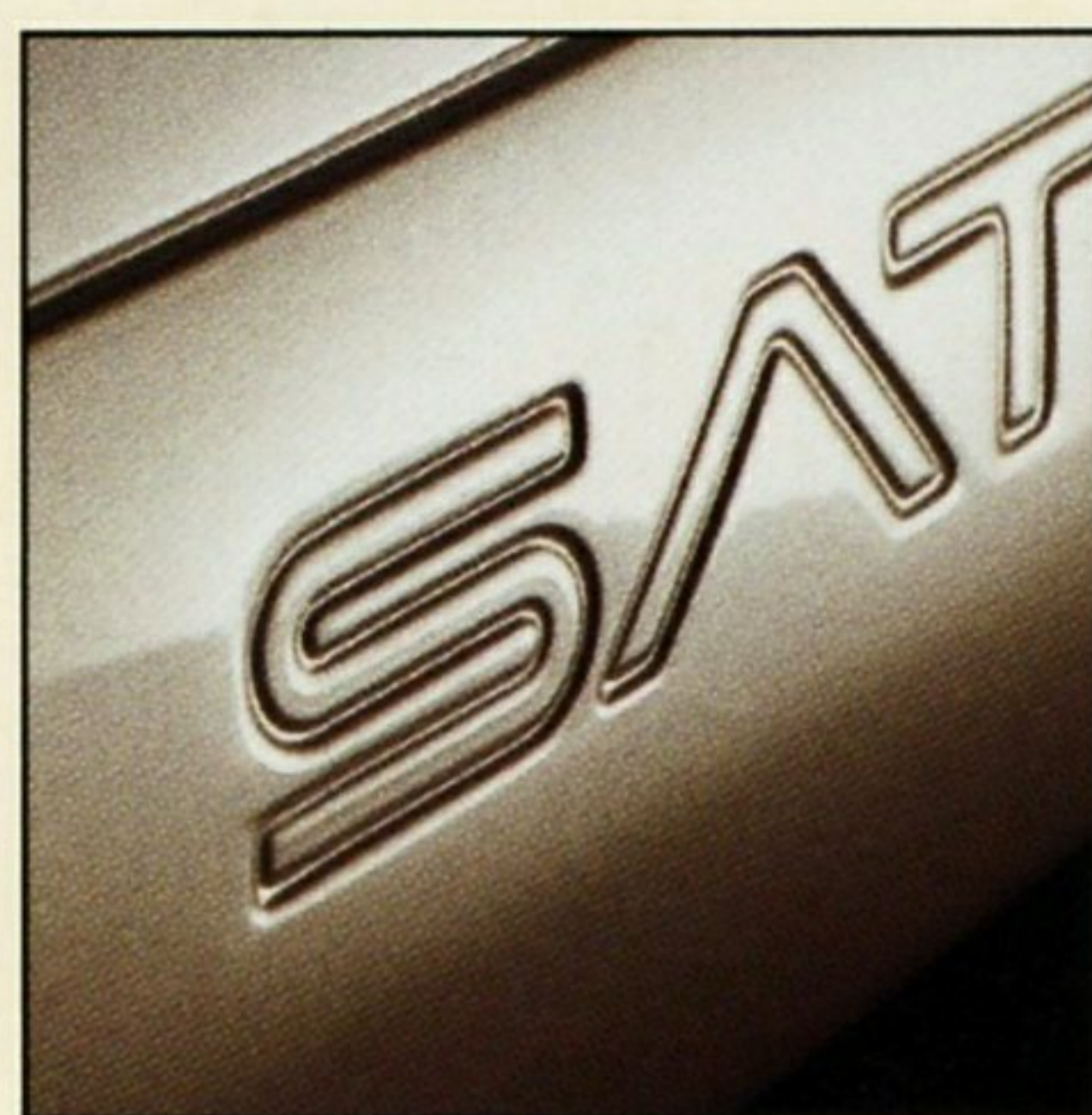
