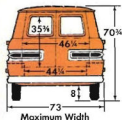
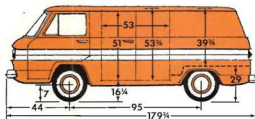
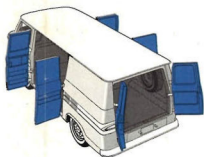

piston rings add to high-mileage durability and smoother break-ins. New self-adjusting brakes increase safety and cut maintenance expense. New higher rate rear springs reduce lean and sway and increase tire life. And new spherical joints on the front suspension contribute to lower maintenance costs by reducing the need for lubrication to once every 6,000 miles.
